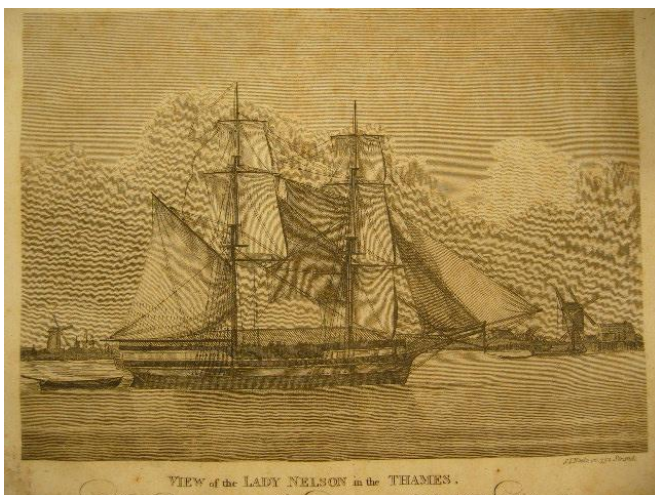

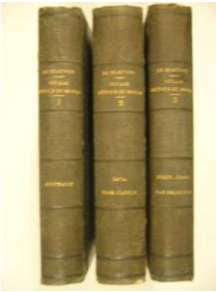

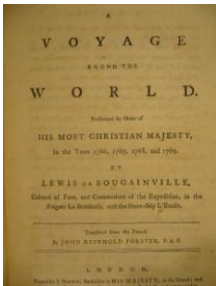

'De Beauvoir's narrative of his travels became immensely popular on account of its perceptive observations of the royal courts of South East Asia, its description of a crocodile and rhinoceros hunt and so on' (*Howgego III, p. 63*). In Macao De Beauvoir saw the last traces of the Portuguese slave trade. In Australia he visited the gold-fields and then passed to Malaysia via de Barrier Reef and Torres Straits. - *A fine illustrated circumnavigation.*

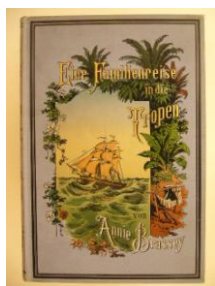

First English edition; first published in French in Paris in 1771 - First official French circumnavigation of the world. Louis Antoine Bougainville gives an account of the discovery, occupation and natural history of the Falkland Islands, which he handed over to Spain. He describes in detail the expulsion of the Jesuits of Paraguay, his visits to Rio de Janeiro, Montevideo and Patagonia in South America, the Tuamotu Archipelago, Tahiti (a vocabulary of Tahiti is added), the Samoa Islands, the New Hebrides, the Solomon, Luisiada, and New Britain archipelago, the Moluccas, etc. are described. Bougainville created a great deal of interest among the French in the Pacific and the French philosophers could substantiate the theories concerning the question of the 'noble savage' and the influence of society and its laws on men. On Tahiti became evident that the botanist's valet was a woman, Jeanne Barre; she stayed with the expedition and became the first woman on record to have circumnavigated the globe.

The translator was John Reinhold Forster, the naturalist who accompanied Cook on his second voyage. - *A fine copy.*

A beautiful watercolour which, for several reasons, probably depicts an island scene in Hawaii. A gracefully executed pandanus tree dominates the right foreground, balanced by the partially cloud-covered, sharply contoured volcanic mountain in the left background. In the

left foreground, a female figure wearing a long skirt and long-sleeved blouse contemplates the water, while behind her in the left middleground are several other figures, one a fully clothed male figure working with a long digging stick. Slightly further behind these figures are two low western style buildings with simple triangular frames. The irrigation channel (similar to those of the Hanalei Valley taro fields on Kauai), the man working with a Polynesian form of digging stick, the style of the houses (similar to that found in Koloa, on Kauai), the volcanic backdrop, the coconut and pandanus trees, and the western style of clothing worn by the figures, all point to a Hawaiian location.

First published in London in 1789. - In 1783, the ship *Antelope* was wrecked in the



Palau (Pelew) Islands of the Caroline Islands. Captain Henry Wilson became quite friendly with King Abba Thulle, who gave him every assistance in building a new ship, the *Oroolong*. Prior to its departure, Abba Thulle requested that Captain Wilson take his son, Lee Boo (Libu), along with him to England, to give him a chance to see the world. They travelled to Macao, where captain Wilson and his charge boarded the *Morse*; they arrived in England in July, 1784. Lee

Boo was impressed by the novelties he saw around him and was constantly thinking of possible advantages to his own countrymen. In England, he lived with Captain Wilson and his family, who grew to love him. They took great pains not to let him become exposed to smallpox, but despite all precautions, Lee Bow contracted the disease and died on December 27, 1784 (*Hill 813*). This account did much to reinforce the idea of the noble savage. - Owner's entry on first free endpaper dated 1805.

First edition published in London in 1788. - In 1783 the East India Packet *Antelope* under command of Henry Wilson, ran onto a reef near one of the Palau Islands, a previously unexplored group, and was wrecked. The crew reached shore and were well treated by the natives. From the wreck they built a small boat which they managed to get to Macao, taking with them Prince Lee Boo, the son of king Abba Thule. Lee Boo soon died of smallpox in England. Captain Wilson allowed Keate (1729-97) to write a faithful account of the events from Wilson's journals and communications. This account did much to reinforce the idea of the noble savage and it is one of the most popular 18th century books on the Pacific and also the main source of early knowledge of the Palau Islands, the most western group of the Caroline archipelago. 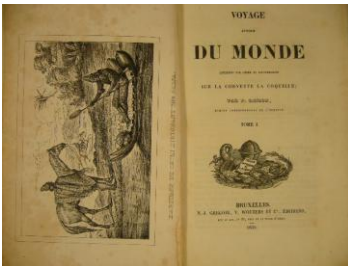

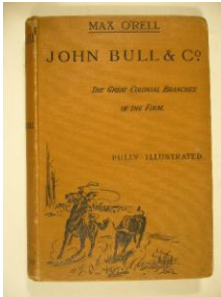

They called at Brazil, the Falkland Islands, Concepción, Callao, Payta, the Tuamotu Archipelago, Tahiti, Port Jackson, Tonga, the Santa Cruz islands, the Moluccas, New Zealand, New Guinea, Java, etc.

He sailed to New Guinea and Timor on the *Triton* in 1828 and remained behind at Kupang in October of that year. In 1829 he penetrated into the interior of Timor, and during 1831 he travelled in Java. In the years 1833-1835 he was exploring West Sumatra. Volumes 4-13 contain accounts of VOC voyages (Warwyck, Van der Haghen, Matelief, Van Caerden, Verhoeven, Van den Broeck, Spilbergen, Bontekoe, Tasman, Schouten, De Graaf, Hamel, Roggeveen, etc.). 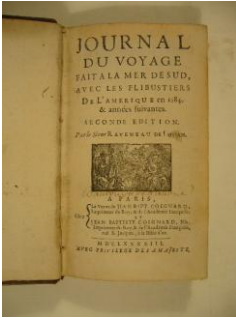

*First edition; copy on large and thick paper; with armorial bookplate of Samuael Beckwith. - Two ships, the *King George* and *Queen Charlotte*, under the commands of Portlock and Dixon were sent out by the King George's Sound Company in 1785 for the purpose of pursuing the fur trade in America and China. Both men had accompanied Captain Cook on his last voyage. After visiting the Falkland Islands, the two ships made a long stay at the Hawaiian Islands, then proceeded to America, they sailed home by way of Macao and St.Helena in 1789. They surveyed the north-west coast of America, which was the most important result of the voyage. This is the principal account of the first commercial voyage to the Northwest Coast and the first English voyage to visit Hawaii after that of Captain James Cook. - Tear in one leaf; dampstain in lower corner of first leaves otherwise fine. - *One of the very few copies with coloured plates.**

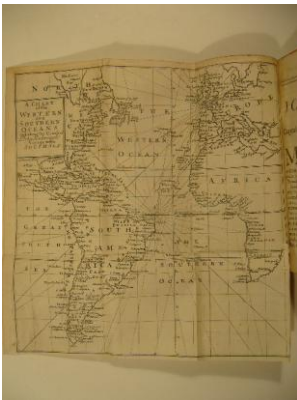

Third edition, first published in Paris in 1689. - 'A rare and charming book. Raveneau de Lussan, a young Frenchman who wished to see the world, sailed from France for San Domingue in 1679. His indebtedness led him to join the buccaneers in search of his fortune. .. Raveneau spent several months raiding in the West Indies, and several years raiding the Pacific coast between Guatemala and Chile. He details both the romantic and the bleak sides of the buccaneering profession, interwoven with colorful descriptions of the natives of the regions and a clear picture of the Spanish colonies on the Pacific' (*Hill 1423*). - (Final leaves waterstained in outer margin).

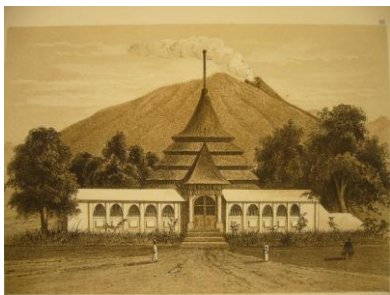

Second edition; first published in London in 1694.

'This second edition is preferred because it has the chart of the western and southern oceans, which was not included in the first edition and additional text relating to Greenland and to whales and whaling' (*Hill p.525*). - Containing I. John NARBROUGH's passage in the *Batchelour* through the Strait of Magellan and into the South Pacific to Chile, which was much read by later navigators. II. One of the earliest English accounts of Abel Janszoon TASMANN's voyage of 1642 from Batavia, during which he discovered Tasmania and New Zealand and visited Tonga and Fiji; based upon the account by Dirk Rembrantszoon van Nierop (Amsterdam 1674); III. Captains John WOOD and William FLAES, in the ships *Speedwel* and *Prosperous*, explored the

Northeast Passage and visited Novaya Zembla. IV. The narrative of Friedrich MARTEN's, here first translated into English, was the first book on a voyage to Spitsbergen and Greenland, undertaken for whaling purposes. The editor of this work is believed to be Sir Tancred Robinson.
