The Élise was the first steamship to cross the English Channel. She was bought in

England in 1814 by Pierre Andriel as *Margery*, and renamed *Élise*. Andriel intended to accomplish a spectacular crossing of the Channel to convince public opinion that steam ships could be ocean-worthy.

The *Élise* departed from Newhaven on 17 March, with a heavy sea. At midnight, a tempest broke out, and Andriel had to threaten his own crew at gunpoint and award three bottles of rum to the first man to spot the French coast. After 17 hours at sea, the *Élise* reached Le Havre. She sailed up the Seine and arrived in Paris on 28 March, becoming a popular sensation. Two small saluting guns were mounted at the bow and fired in honour of Louis XVIII. - *Fine*.







edition, then by Danish, Dutch, English, and French editions' (*Ingalls 446*). The first part contains an account on whaling and a Danish-Dutch-Greenland vocabulary and grammar. The second part by Niels Horrebow contains the corrections and an extensive description of Iceland's natural history. The ship was helpless in the storm, and just as it was feared that she would founder she struck on the coast of Cuba. Most of the crew, about 250, were rescued by small ships from Jamaica after Archer had sailed a ship's boat to Montego Bay. Most of the other ships lost had no survivors. Archer's lively letter to his mother gives many details of the cruise and wreck' (*Huntress* p.54). - *Rare popular edition.* - *Huntress* 153C.

First edition. - 'The most important general history of early South Sea discoveries, containing practically everything of importance on the subject' (*Hill*). 'This important and comprehensive work brings the history of the Pacific discovery down to 1764, when Hawkesworth continues it. It must always form the basis of historical research for early voyages and discoveries throughout the Pacific' (*Hocken*). Burney's collection covers more than 250 years of Pacific exploration prior to that of Cook, beginning with Magellan and ending with Bougainville's voyage to Tahiti. Including Spanish, Dutch, French and English voyages. Many of the accounts published here would be inaccessible were they not herein collected. Volume four contains a history of the buccaneers of America. Burney sailed with Captain Cook as lieutenant on his second and third voyages. - Some foxing, slight browning and some offsetting in places otherwise a fine copy of the classic history of the South Seas before Cook.



Histoire des navigations aux terres Australes by Des Brosses, Paris 1756. This two-volume edition contains a total of forty-one narratives, some in English for the first time, including the voyages of Hawkins, Quiros, Spilbergen, Le Maire and Schouten, Pelsaert, Tasman, Dampier, Shelvocke, Anson, etc. The final section contains Callander's essay 'Advantages from the forming of colonies in the Terra Australis', first published in 1768. This has been described as 'the fundamental proposal for the first European settlement of the Southern continent'. 'The work is valuable both for its narratives and for its editorial comments' (Cox I, p.18). An important early collection depicting the discovery, exploration, natural history, geography and commerce of Australia. - (First leaves volume I waterstained; age-browned). - *A very*


the freed slave Edward Donellan. On arrival at Tangier the British consul begged Davidson to give up his visit to Timbuktu on account of the tribal warfare being waged on the edge of the Sahara, but the explorer pressed on regardless. He arrived at Fez and left for the desert, passing through Marrakesh, and eventually reached the Wadi Num (Noun or Assaka). In the region of Tindouf he was shot dead and his possessions stolen. Donellan continued with the caravan to Timbuktu and was never heard of again. Davidson's letters and most of his journal found their way back to Britain and were privately published in 1839 (*Howgego D4*). Second French edition, first edition in 8vo; first published in Paris in 1797. - La Pérouse's (1741 - 1788) expedition was one of the most important scientific explorations ever undertaken to the Pacific and the west coast of North America. He led the first French expedition to Alaska, and the first non-Spanish one to California. Many important discoveries were made including that of the strait between the island of Sakhalin and Japan, named after La Pérouse. After extensive exploration in the Pacific, he arrived in Botany Bay on the 24th January 1788. When the *Boussole* and the *Astrolabe* sailed out of Botany Bay on 10th March 1788 they were never seen again, and this disappearance became the greatest maritime mystery of the 18th

century. Not until 39 years later it was established by the sea-captain Dillon that the expedition had ended its days on the reef of Vanoriko, one of the Santa Cruz Islands. 

With the support of the English, Danes and Portuguese, he had long resisted the efforts of the Dutch East India Company (VOC) to monopolize the spice trade. Alarmed by this development, Batavia in 1666 sent an expedition against Makassar led by Cornelis Speelman (1628-1684). He

forced the sultan in 1669 to conclude a treaty which the Dutch, obtained a monopoly of Makassar's trade and succeeded in bringing South Celebes under Dutch supremacy with the help of the Bugis people who were being oppressed by the Macassarrese. - *Very rare.*





'Spilbergen had succeeded in establishing the power and reputation of the Dutch East India Company. In Java he took on board the crew of Le Maire and Schouten whose vessels had been confiscated. Le Maire and Schouten had discovered several small islands, Staten Landt, and the Straits of Le Maire, and had been the first to round Cape Horn' (*Hill 1619*). 'Spilbergen's voyage was the most succesful Dutch circumnavigation to date. The fleet had kept together, there had been little loss of Dutch life, and the expedition had metted a considerable profit for its sponsors' (*Howgego S159*).
