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




Illustration on cover no. 68 **LATROBE, Christian Ignatius.** Journal of a visit to South Africa, in 1815, and 1816. London, 1818.

Also on board was H.R.M. Hendrik, Prince of the Netherlands. Arriëns had not planned to publish his notes, but with the outbreak of the Crimean War (1853-1856) he felt the need to inform the Dutch public on the current situation in Constantinople (*Koster, To Hellen's noble land, p. 148.*)



Depicting the canal houses with on the right the Oudemanhuispoort, and on the left the Nieuwe Doelenstraat. In front the canal with several vessels with spectators. With circumstantial description of the participants and the route. The naval Battle of the Dogger Bank took place on 5 August 1781 during the Fourth Anglo-Dutch War, part of the American War of Independence, in the North Sea. It was a bloody encounter between a British squadron under Vice Admiral Sir Hyde Parker, 5th Baronet and a Dutch squadron under Vice Admiral Johan Zoutman, both of which were escorting convoys. -







Second English edition, first published in Dutch in 1704. - Willem Bosman (1672 - ?), employee of the Dutch West India Company (WIC) and chief Dutch factor at the castle of Elmina, wrote the first authoritative and detailed account of the West Coast of Africa, during a 14 years' residence there. It is the chief source for the knowledge of the Dutch slave-trade during the second half of the 17th century. It also gives an interesting picture of international rivalry, current trade, and the wretched depraved existence of the European factors stationed permanently on the coast. The book is written in the form of letters to a friend. The last two letters are written by other authors. The first is written by David van Nyendael containing a description of Rio Formosa, or Benin. The second is written by Jan Snoek giving a description of the Tooth and Grain Coast. The fine plates depict the trade-settlements on the West African coast. 'Usually recognised as the standard work concerning the Gold Coast of this period' (*Cardinall 256*). - *Fine*.







This work deserves attention for its forthright and sometimes provocative descriptions of Russian manners and character (*Hill 277*). First collective Dutch edition. - The three great voyages by James Cook (1728-1779), the first really scientific navigator. Vol. I-III contain the life of Cook and the first voyage 1768-1771, vol. IV-VII contain the second voyage 1772-1775, vol. VIII-XIII contain the third voyage 1776-1780. 'Cook earned his place in history by opening up the Pacific to western civilization and by foundation of British Australia. The world was given for the first time an essentially complete knowledge of the Pacific Ocean and Australia, and Cook proved once and for all that there was no great southern continent, as had always been believed. He also suggested the existence of antarctic land in the southern ice ring, a fact which was not proved until the explorations up the 19th century. Cook was a brilliant navigator and hydrographer, an excellent administrator and planner, and probably the first sea captain to realize the importance of preserving the health and well-being of his crew' (*P.M.M.* p.135). - (Some volumes sl. waterstained).





Dutch slave-trade was abolished in 1814 and slavery in 1863 in Suriname and the Dutch Antilles. Slave owners received compensation from the government. The former slave owner Cornelis Sprocke Jansz was entitled to receive 1000 guilders in



exchange for this letter. The letter served as a receipt, signed and stamped by the accountant Gorsira and the governor of Curaçao Grol on August 25, 1863 and cashed on October 16, 1863 - *Rare document of slavery.*


First Dutch edition; first published in French in Leiden in 1687: Relation de l'inquisition de Goa. - In 1668 Dellon sailed to India with the Compagnie des Indes. He travelled extensively along the Malabar coast. In 1673 he left the employment of



the company and started a private medical practice in Damao, at that time a Portuguese colony. Six months later, early in 1674, he was arrested by the Inquisition and taken to Goa, where he was imprisoned for two years. He was then shipped to Lisbon, but released in the following year on condition that he should return immediately to France. .. It proved a considerable success , particularly in Protestant Europe, where it ran to numerous editions. Although long regarded purely as a work of propaganda, recent research has testified to its accuracy (*Howgego p.304/305*). ' Dellon's description of the Inquisition and of the practices of its officials and their collaborators is the only source

available on the functioning of that institution by a contemporary who saw it from the inside' (*Lach, Asia in the making of Europe III,2, p.851*). It includes also details of his stay in Bahia, Brazil. His account of the Inquisition was still forbidden in Portugal in 1769. - *A nice copy*.



finally solved. After various adventures in Australia, New Zealand, and Tonga, Dillon found the wrecks of the lost ships on the reefs surrounding Vanikoro in the Santa Cruz Islands. He brought the news back to captain Dumont d'Urville, then at Hobart, who proceeded back to the location and recovered further relics. *Cat. A fascinating depiction of the loss of a French man-of-war steamer *Le Papin*, and half her crew on 6 December 1845 off Mazagan, now El Jadida, in Morocco. *Le Papin* was one of the vessels destined to form the French squadron on the coast of Africa for the suppression of the slave trade, and was on her way to Senegal, intending to call at Mogador. I have this moment heard from the office of the British consul of the total wreck on the coast, between Azmoor and Mazagan, of another French man of war steamer, of 650 tons burden, and 140 horse power. The details are very shocking, and the number of lives lost are 77, including the captain and all the officers. with the exception of one midshipman. The newly appointed French

consul to Mogador is numbered among the victims. Exactly one half of those on board the unfortunate vessel were drowned, the other half were saved under circumstances which reflect the highest credit on the British and French consul at Mazagan. Mr. Redman, for it was to his prompt arrival at the spot, and his energetic persuasion of the Moors to assist him, that the survivors owe their lives' (*Shipping Gazette*).



In 1778, Sparrman was back in Sweden, where he had been appointed president of the natural history collection of Stockholm's Academy of Sciences. Sparrman's account of Cook's voyage of 1772-75 helped popularize the newly devised Linnaen system of classification and nomenclature by applying it to the new varieties of plants and animals he had collected. 



Charlows (?) was entitled to receive 8000 guilders in exchange for this letter. The letter served as a receipt, signed and stamped by the accountant Immerzeel and the governor of Suriname Van Lansberge on July 16,





Lord Cornwallis's capture of Tipu's capital, Seringapatam, was greeted with acclaim. Tipu was forced to pay the Company an indemnity of more than 33 million rupees and hand

over half his territories along with all his prisoners. He was also forced to give his sons, the princes Abdul Khaliq and Muiz-ud-din into Cornwallis's hands as hostages by the Treaty of Seringapatam (1792).
