



Including the history of the discovery of Celebes. Contributions by G.J. Hinde, G.F. Dollfus, W.F. Gisolf, J.H. Kruimel, S.J. Vermaes and M. Weber. 'During two years Abendanon crosses Celebes for geographical and geological research. 'The result of this expedition is recorded in a beautifully published, voluminous four-volume book of 1900 pages with many illustrations and maps, the most expensive publication ever financed by the KNAG.' Linschoten Vereeniging CXXI. - Cornelis (Kees) Abrahamsz Jr. (1802-1879) came from a family of Amsterdam merchants, charterers and shipowners. He wanted to join the navy, but it became merchant navy. At twenty-seven he became a captain. In total Kees made fifty sea voyages. He married Catharina (Kaatje) Douwes

Dekker. His *Memories*, written for son Theodorus, are candid, humorous and at times emotional, especially about the influence of brother-in-law Eduard (Multatuli) on the family. Kees interweaves his private life with a detailed description of his life as a sailor and experiences in Suriname and the Indies.

A completely revised and enlarged second edition of the ethnographic volumes; first edition published in Batavia, Landsdrukkerij, 1912-1914. - The language spoken in the central area of Sulawesi, mainly the district of Poso, was for a long time, following the local custom, known as Bare', its word for 'not', but has recent years been renamed Pamona, which is a place on the northern bank of Lake Poso. A description of the language by Nicolaus Adriani (1865-1926) was not included in this re-edition. 

London 1868. - The American professor in natural history Bickmore (1839-1914), sponsored by the Boston Society of Natural History, arrived in 1865 in Indonesia to study the natural history. Besides the flora and fauna he also devoted a great deal of attention to the physical geography and the population. The concept of a Western and Eastern division between the Indonesian peoples was initiated by him. Batavia, Semarang, Surabaya, Celebes, the Moluccas, Sumatra and Singapore were visited. Despite obtaining trading rights for the VOC, Roy was outlawed for absconding with the ship's money and subsequently sailed as a free trader in the Indies, visiting Borneo, Sumatra and Siam. Having acquired a considerable fortune from his enterprises, he was employed by the king of Siam to dispose of a certain English pirate who was visiting Siamese waters. The Roy's account includes brief descriptions of both Brunei and Sukadana although most of his description concern Banjarmasin.
