

First edition. - In 1862 Thomas Belt (1852-1878) sailed for Central America to take charge of the Chontales gold mines in central Nicaragua, arriving at Greytown in the steam-ship *Solent*. From here he moved south, ascended the San Juan River to the Lago de Nicaragua, then followed the northeastern shore of the lake to Acoyapo and the goldminning village of Santo Domingo, located between the Siquia and Mico rivers. This remained Belt's base of operations for several years, but numerous excursions were made into the surrounding country. In 1872, his final year in the country, he made a long and difficult journey to the north (*Howgego IV*, p.75).

Besides descriptions of nature in the area, the author describes the people, their customs, culture, society, ancient artifacts, etc Charles Darwin wrote on Belt's book "it appears to be the best of all Natural History Journals which have ever been published". *Palau 26647; Wood, p. 230.*

First edition. - Pierre Jacques Benoit (1782 - 1854) a Belgian draftsman and painter, visited around 1830 the Dutch colony of Suriname on its own initiative. He visited Paramaribo, but also plantations and villages of Maroons and Indians. He made a large number of drawings in which he tried to capture the real life of the people. His book is a journalistic report of the country and its populations with all their strange customs, objects, festivals and rituals. It is considered to be one of the most beautiful books on Suriname with detailed and informative illustrations. Benoit was also one of the first to make an emphatic distinction in his descriptions between city and plantation slaves.

The very attractive set of views of Suriname include fine scenes of native life, showing costumes, dwellings, ceremonies, festivals, recreations, interiors, utensils, etc. of the Black- and Indian population, including several images relating to the Jewish population of the colony. A beautiful lithographed plates-book on the people and life in Suriname. - Except some marginal foxing as usual, not affecting the images, a fine large-paper copy.


First edition. - Steven Adriaan Buddingh (1811-1869), Minister at Batavia, was charged with the inspection of the Protestant churches and schools in Indonesia in 1851, he spent a total of five years (1852-57) completing the assignment. He visited

Java, Madura, Celebes, the Moluccas (Ternate, Batjan, Banda, Amboina, Haroekoe, Saparoea, Noussalaut, Ceram), Floris, Timor, Banka, Sumatra and Borneo. The fine coloured plates by Carl Wilhelm Mieling represent a variety of views in the archipelago. 'This is more than a travelogue, containing as it does information on a wide range of subjects skilfully interwoven into the narrative. Of particular importance is the discussion of Hindu-Javanese antiquities and the description of towns and their inhabitants .. Second and best edition, first published in 1737. - Pieter de la Court van der Voort (1664-1739) was, through his wife, the owner of the Berbice country estate in Voorschoten from 1688 to 1716. Under his leadership, the property grew into a beautiful country estate with a formal garden layout that was customary for the time, with an orangery, barge house, orchards, a walled vegetable garden and several experimental espalier fruit walls. He designed the Berbice orangery from 1696 after he had traveled around Europe to gain knowledge and inspiration. His international network was large and included people like Tsar Peter the Great of Russia, who even came to Berbice to admire the orangery. Pieter is the first to get a pineapple to flower and fruit in the Netherlands, which was very special at that time. His knowledge about growing (tropical) fruits and his ideas about the construction and design of country estates became widespread with the publication of his book. Because it was also translated into French and German, it reached an unprecedentedly wide audience. - The first book on succesful ananas-growing in Europe. - (Age-browned).

Rembert Dodonaeus (1517-1585), Flemish physician and botanist, was one of the great Flemish botanists in the second half of the 16th century. In 1582 Dodonaeus was appointed professor of botany at the University of Leiden. In his Cruydt- boeck, Dodoens for the first time classified the plants according to their characteristics.



First published in 1857. - In 1852 Livingstone asked his family to join him in Africa. With the help of the

Makololos, a South African tribe, Livingstone planned to explore the whole of southern Africa as far as Angola. The missionary had become an important explorer. As the first European, he traveled on the Zambezi to Kazembe in a pirogue, a fast water vessel made from a tree trunk. In order to escape from the slave traders of Portuguese Africa, Livingstone traveled via Cassange and Bihé to Luanda, a Portuguese port and the capital of Angola, where he arrived completely exhausted on 31 May, 1854. As soon as he had recovered from his fever, he undertook a trek to Lake Dilolo, discovered the source of the Kasai, a left tributary of the Congo, and arrived in Linyanti, the capital of the Makololos. In the course of the major Zambezi expedition that

followed he discovered the Victoria Falls, the falls of the middle Zambezi, in 1855 (*Waldmann, Ecyclopedia of world explorers, p.226*). *Mendelssohn I, p.908-10; SAB III, p.136; Hess & Coger 3068*.





Not included in the collection of Van der Aa, *Naaukeurige versameling der gedenk-waardigste zee en land reysen*, but separately issued as a supplement. - Jacob Janssen de Roy's book, the largest single description of Borneo printed during the century, which probably appeared in 1698 or 1699 for the first time, is an extended apologia written to the governor-general and council at Batavia by a skipper who had lost his ship on the coast of Borneo in February, 1692, as a result of the mutiny of his largely Chinese and Javanese crew. He and his shipmates barely survived hunger, thirst, exposure, hostile natives, and treachery before receiving good

treatment and protection from the king of Banjarmasin in return for military assistance. Despite obtaining trading rights for the VOC, Roy was outlawed for absconding with the ship's money and subsequently sailed as a free trader in the Indies, visiting Borneo, Sumatra and Siam. Having acquired a considerable fortune from his enterprises, he was employed by the king of Siam to dispose of a certain English pirate who was visiting Siamese waters. The Roy's account includes brief descriptions of both Brunei and Sukadana although most of his description concern Banjarmasin. He also provided European readers with their first published description of Borneo's interior and of the people who lived there (*Lach, Asia in the making of Europe, III*, p.1390-1395). - Including an extensive description of the gold and diamonds mines on Borneo and the pirates of Palembang. - *A fine copy*.



Following his defeat in the Third Mysore War (1790-1792) the British made Tipu Sultan cede part of his dominions, pay a substantial financial settlement and surrender two of his 16 sons as hostages. Princes Mohin-ud-din (or Moiz-ud-din) (aged eight) and Abdul Khalik (aged ten) were accordingly delivered to Lord Cornwallis, the Governor-General of India, at Seringapatam on 26 February 1792. In February 1794, after the fulfilment of the treaty, the princes returned to Seringapatam. They enjoyed a few years of peace but the conflict between Mysore and the British resumed in 1799. On 4 May that year Mysore's capital was captured and Tipu Sultan was killed alongside 10,000 of his subjects. The princes were captured by Major-General David Baird, who treated them with great respect and arranged for

their safe passage out of the devastated city. After laying their dead father to rest they were then sent to Vellore. In 1806, following a mutiny at Vellore among the soldiers of the Madras Army, the princes were exiled to Calcutta along with the rest of Tipu's family, lest they become a figurehead for opposition to British rule in southern India. - *Fine*.



First edition. - The Southwest New Guinea Expedition to the Maoke Mountains (Sneeuwgebergte) was a Dutch scientific exploration expedition set out in 1904-1905 by the Royal Dutch Geographical Society with the aim of mapping the totally unknown interior of southwestern

New Guinea. The expedition would be the very first Dutch attempt to penetrate the interior of the island, of which in fact only parts of the coastal strips had been explored.

The general leadership was in the hands of former naval officer R. Posthumus Meyes, his wife also took part in the entire expedition. E.J. de Rochemont, an officer in the Indian Army, was given command over the inland expeditions. J.W.R. Koch, a cousin of Posthumus Meyes, was the expedition doctor who would also carry out the

ethnographic and biological research. The geologist was C. Moerman and Controller J. Seyne Kok also took part in the expedition as a representative of the Dutch government. Added were 65 soldiers and more than 160 coolies under the command of Lieutenant C. Onvleé. Finally, the government made 20 forced labourers, convicted criminals, available to the expedition.

The journey inland took 87 days. Maps were drawn, measurements taken, ethnographic objects and biological specimens collected, and mountains climbed to more than 2000 meters, but the expedition was nevertheless considered a failure because the intended end point, the eternal snow, had not been reached and there were a number of deaths among the indigenous participants.
