

Dealing with the Indians (Kalina's Arrowaks) and Bushnegroes and Creoles, sources of income, dress, work, religion and social institutions. The photographs, all taken at the exhibition by M. Hisgen, contain portraits of male and female members of all ages of the Indian and black population groups. This comprehensive anthropological study on Suriname was





The publication of *Ourika* in 1824 was one of the hugest successes among

feminine novels. Instantly popular, this novel drew with finesse the story of a young black slave in love with the son of her protector (*Lucien Scheler in Le Bulletin du bibliophile, Paris, 1988*). - The very first romance novel about a young black Senegalese woman, rescued from slavery and taken to France, who secretly loves a white man. This novel by Claire Duras (1777 - 1828) still reminds a striking commentary on race, set in the days before, during, and after the French Revolution. History of three geneations de Gerlache de Gomery (1897-1997) who executed scientific research in the polar regions. Adrien Victor Joseph, Baron de Gerlache de Gomery (1866–1934), was a Belgian explorer and officer

in the Belgian Royal Navy. He led the Belgian Antarctic Expedition of 1897–1899. His party was the first to winter in Antarctica. Baron Gaston de Gerlache de Gomery (1919–2006) was the son of Adrien de Gerlache. He gained fame following in his father's footsteps by leading the second Belgian expedition to Antarctica in 1957–1958, 60 years after his father led the first with the *Belgica*. During this second

expedition, which took them to Antarctica with the *Polarhav* and the *Polarsirkel*, the King Baudouin Base was established there. His five children have all been to polar regions: Bernard was allowed to travel with his father on an icebreaker to Greenland in 1961, when he was only 13. He was stationed at the South Pole in 1972 and 1973 as an observer with the United States Antarctic Research Program. Jean-Louis was also there in 1961. Later, he served three times as an assistant on archaeological research in the Arctic. François wintered on Brabant Island in Antarctica in 1984-85. Henrianne assisted with archaeological research in the Arctic in 1978. Hélène did the same in 1985. Henri, a son of Bernard, climbed Mount Vinson in Antarctica in 1998.







Due to heavy ice, the expedition led by Maurits Snellen was unable to reach Dickson, but observations were made on the frozen Kara Sea. After the sinking of the expedition ship *Varna in* the pack ice of the Kara Sea, near Nova Zembla, the men spent the long dark polar winter on an ice floe and managed to reach the mainland the following summer, after three weeks of struggling over melting and tilting pack ice. - (Slight foxing throughout).


